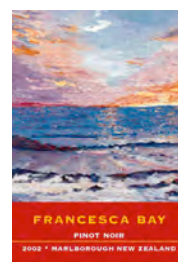
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WINE LIST TASTING GUIDE. 1

To help you in your choice of wine, you will find a number or a letter against each wine which will indicate the style of wine you are choosing.

If it is a white wine, then a **number** will give an indication of how dry that wine is. For instance number **1** would tell you that the wine is very dry, number **2** would still be dry but not as dry as number **1**, and so on. This follows right up to number **9**, which would describe a very, very, sweet white wine. Where it becomes complicated is that most white wines are numbered between **1** and **3**, and rarely go above **4**!

In the case of red wines, then a **letter** is used to indicate how light or full-bodied the wine is. The letter **A** for instance would tell you that it is a light-bodied red. The letters **B&C** would indicate a more medium-bodied style of wine, while **D&E** would mean that the wine would be full-bodied.

Please just let us know in advance if you would like your choice of red wine opened in advance of you going through to the dining-room. This can be done at any stage prior to dinner.

We have tried to gently pressurise our wine suppliers to come up with as wide a choice of half bottles as possible. That said, do not worry if you find that a full bottle is too much to drink in one sitting - just leave the bottle on your table, and ask for it again the following evening. All we will need to know is your room number.

If wines of one year can no longer be supplied, we will try and offer the same wine from as near a year as possible.

- 10 **MAILLART Premier Cru NV (3)** £26.00
The Nicolas Maillart family have run their vineyards for nine generations now. This champagne is delicate and dry, with light biscuity flavours.
- 11 **MOET ET CHANDON NV (2)** £35.00 £23.00
Consistently good champagne from probably the world's biggest producer of champagne - very clean and fresh, and ideal for a party or a special occasion.

SPARKLING WINES

- 12 **VILARNAU CAVA BRUT (2)** £14.00
This sparkling Cava from Spain's Penedes region is dry to taste, with fine, long lasting bubbles.
- 13 **LECONFIELD SPARKLING AUSTRALIAN RED (C)** £17.50
This beautifully balanced, creamy sparkling red wine has lively raspberry and cherry flavours, and finishes with a soft and cleansing acidity.
- 14 **KATHERINE HILLS SPARKLING BRUT (2)** £13.00
From southern Australia, this is a pleasant easy drinking sparkler.
- 15 **PIERRE DELIZE, BRUT NV Domaine Auran (2)** £15.00
A French sparkling wine which is made by the cuvee close method. It has a nose of butter and hazelnuts, and tastes of brioches and almonds.
- 16 **MOSCATO SPUMANTE BOTTER (7)** £13.00
The muscat grape normally produces a sweet, grape like wine. This Italian sparkling wine, like Asti Spumante, has a surprisingly low alcoholic strength of around 7%.

NON-ALCOHOLIC WINE

- 17 **SPARKLING ELDERFLOWER (4)** £9.75
Produced at Errol, Perthshire, this wine is made from elder blossoms, picked in early summer from wild bushes in the Carse of Gowrie.

Bottled at source in the Vale of Strathmore near Glamis Castle, choose from either STILL or SLIGHTLY SPARKLING mineral water.

FRANCE (LANGUEDOC)

- 18 **MERLOT** 2009/10 **(B/C)** £13.00
 The Skalli Family, Vin de Pays D'Oc.
 From the south of France, this Merlot has an appealing silky texture, and aromas of plum and red fruit. It goes well with white meats, lamb, and vegetable terrines.

FRANCE (BORDEAUX)

- 19 **MEDOC A.C.** 2008/09 **(C)** £16.00
 Dulong Reserve
 A blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, and Merlot, this wine is deep red in colour with a blackcurrant bouquet. It is medium to full bodied in strength.
- 20 **CHATEAU LYONNAT** 2006/07 £21.00 £11.00
 Lussac St. Emilion **(B)**
 Lussac's hill-vineyards lie to the hinterland of St. Emilion. A soft, rich, and slightly savoury claret, with the ripe fruit of the Merlot grape. It is less dry and scented than the Medoc.
- 21 **CHATEAU HAUT-BEAUSEJOUR** 2006/07 £29.00
 Saint-Estephe Cru Bourgeois OWC **(C)**
 This property was bought in 1992 by Champagne Louis Roederer, with the aim of producing top class Bordeaux wines. Solid, substantial, and concentrated in the mouth, the wine contains a spicy hint of tannin.
- 22 **CHATEAU CISSAC** 2007/08 £22.00 £12.00
 Haut Medoc, Cru Bourgeois OWC **(C)**
 A Cru Bourgeois from the heart of the Haut Medoc appellation, the village of Cissac lies in the hinterland behind Pauillac and St. Estephe. This wine is made from hand picked grapes and spends eighteen months in barrel, resulting in a rich and intense wine.

FRANCE (BEAUJOLAIS)

- 23 **BEAUJOLAIS VILLAGES A.C.** 2008/09 **(B)** £16.00 £8.00
 Domaine des Charmeuses, Henry Fessy
 Approximately forty villages go to make up the Beaujolais A.C. region. A soft, fresh, light and fruity wine from the Gamay grape, it can also be very nice when served with cold dishes.
- 24 **FLEURIE** Henry Fessy 2009 **(B/C)** £21.00 £11.00
 Domaine de la Roilette
 Fleurie is one of only a small number of Grand Crus Beaujolais districts. Another wine made from the Gamay grape, it is soft, and silky, with raspberry fruit, and is purple red in colour.

Cellier du Jolibois 2008

Comte Raimbauld 2007/08

- 32 **BAROLO** £26.00
 DOCG, Botter, 2005/06 **(D/E)**
 Piedmont is sometimes described as Italy's equivalent of the Rhone valley, with Barolo, made from the Nebbiolo grape, as one of its great growths. It is a very big, fruity, and heavy wine, with three years in oak casks as a statutory requirement. Recommended with roasted and boiled meats, game, and aged hard cheeses.

SPAIN

- 33 **RIOJA, CRIANZA** £14.00 £8.00
 Beronia, 2007 **(C)**
 A blend of Tempranillo, Garnacha, and Mazuelo grapes. Aromas of vanilla, raspberry, and cherry dominate the bouquet, with a fresh and fruity palate. Aged for at least a year in French and American oak casks.
- 34 **FINCA CONSTANCIA** £16.00
 Vine de Castilla, 2008 **(C/D)**
 The flagship wine from Finca Constancia is a blend of Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon, Petit Verdot, Tempranillo, Graciano and Cabernet Franc. A full bodied red, it has complex aromas of rich spice, vanilla, and oak. I.W.C. commended.

AUSTRALIA

- 35 **MERLOT** £15.00
 Red Earth 2007/08 **(C)**
 This south eastern Australian merlot is firm and lush, with a strong backbone of tannins. Fresh cherry and mulberry flavours, linger over clove and cinnamon and chocolate aromas.
- 36 **SHIRAZ / CABERNET** £12.00
 Jacobite Ridge, 2009 **(C)**
 This southern Australian blend of two grape varieties is deep coloured with rich spice and bramble aromas, leading on to a full flavoured, soft, and warming palate.
- 37 **LECONFIELD SPARKLING AUSTRALIAN RED (C)** £17.50
 This beautifully balanced, creamy sparkling red wine has lively raspberry and cherry flavours, and finishes with a soft and cleansing acidity.
- 38 **CABERNET SAUVIGNON** £15.00
 Red Earth, 2006/07 **(C)**
 This wine has a juicy cassis style showing off the warmth of South Australia. It is deep ruby and purple in colour, with blackcurrant and mint aromas. It's makers say that it goes best with roast meats.

 Red Rock, 2008 (D)
 The Syrah grape, which is well known in the Rhone Valley, is planted widely in Australia where it is known as Shiraz. This is a rich, savoury Shiraz from South Eastern Australia with dark chocolate, cinnamon and white pepper on the finish.
- 40 **SANGIOVESE** £17.00
 Ceravolo Estate, 2007/08 (B/C)
 A wine from the Adelaide Plains, it has aromas of violets, cherries, and raspberries. Winner of the Silver Medal at the Queensland Show, it is soft and velvety yet spicy, ageing for a year in French and American oak.

SOUTH AFRICA

- 41 **PINOTAGE** £12.00
 The Veldt Range, Robertson 2009/10 (C/D)
 Pinotage is a grape variety unique to South Africa. A medium bodied wine, it is packed with ripe, jammy fruits of the forest flavours - soft, mellow, and velvety smooth.
- 42 **RUBY CABERNET** £10.00
 The Veldt Range, Robertson 2009/10 (C/D)
 From the Robertson Valley, to the north east of Stellenbosh. Featuring a drawing of a hippopotamus on its label, this wine's opulent black fruit character is combined with low levels of tannin.
- 43 **MERLOT** £14.00
 Cape Agulhas 2007/08 (C)
 An aroma of ripe mulberry and subtle mint opens to a sweet, succulent palate of plums and a faint trace of smokiness. Finely grained tannins, and a good balance between fruit and wood. Awarded three stars in the 2009 John Platter guide to South African wines.

CHILE

- 44 **MERLOT** £12.00 £6.95
 Torreón de Parades 2009 (C)
 From the Rengo district of Chile, at the foot of the Andes. Coloured ruby red with dark violet hints, the wine has aromas of ripe black fruit, cherry and mulberry. The palate is young, fruity, smooth and medium bodied.
- 45 **CABERNET SAUVIGNON, RESERVE** £16.00
 Torreón de Parades 2008 (D)
 Cabernet Sauvignon is the benchmark grape of the Rengo district. This is a deep ruby in colour, and has been matured in French oak barrels for a year. The nose is of red and ripe fruits, with vanilla, and black chocolate nuances. The palate is a mouthful of firm tannins and a long finish.

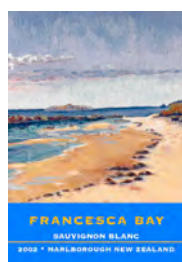
- 47 **PINOT NOIR** £16.00
 Francesca Bay 2008/09 (B)
 This classic New Zealand Pinot Noir is grown on selected Marlborough vineyards, and is harvested by hand. Aged in oak casks, it has a vibrant colour, and a complex abundance of strawberry, cherry, and dark berry fruit.

UNITED STATES

- 48 **ZINFANDEL** £18.00
 Knotty Vines, 2008 (B/C)
 This Californian red is a fusion of flavour illustrating both sides of Zinfandel's tasty personality - vibrant fresh red berry fruit, is combined with a jammy, black pepper spiciness.

ARGENTINA

- 49 **SYRAH** £10.00
 Goyenechea, 2008/09 (C)
 Goyenechea is a family concern established in 1868, which owns sites on the Rio Atuel in San Rafeal. Made from the Syrah grape, this is a fruity, easy drinking red with a slightly spicy finish. It has been described as a little bit like Beaujolais in character.

Louis Latour 2008/09 (2)

Pierre Brevin, La Janais 2009
A white wine for those who prefer a slightly sweeter range of taste. This is a medium-sweet wine with good ripe fruit flavours - it is made from the Chenin Blanc grape. | £16.00 | |

Comte Jean Marechal 2009
A crisp dry white from the little village of Chavignol. With gooseberry flavours, it is less flinty or chalky than the Chablis. It goes well with any white meat, and is particularly good with seafood and shellfish. | £23.00 | £13.00 |

 Beronia, 2009
 A very pleasant straw green in colour, this wine is made from the Viura grape in Rioja in the north of Spain. With no oak contact, this delicate wine has aromas of peach and lily petals.

- 58 **PINOT GRIGIO** £11.00
 La Casada, 2010 (2)
 A light white wine from vineyards near Venice, in northern Italy. It is fresh and dry in style, with hints of citrus and peach. A refreshing aperitif, it also works well with seafood salads, fish and shellfish based pasta dishes, and white meat.

GERMANY

- 59 **PIESPORTER MICHELSBERG** £11.00
 QBA Schmitt and Sohne 2008/09 (4)
 A very reliable light wine. This easy drinking, flowery, very popular style of medium-sweet white wine, originates from the village of Piesport in the upper reaches of the Mosel Valley.
- 60 **SIEGEL RIESLING** £14.00
 Mosel, Ernst Loosen 2009 (3)
 This is a fresh, clean Reisling made in the fruity still of the Mosel region. The tropical peachy fruit on the palate is balanced by a lovely citric acidity. Nice by itself or with mild cheeses, salads, shellfish and poultry.

AUSTRALIA

- 61 **CHARDONNAY** £12.00
 Red Rock, 2010 (3)
 A very popular choice from South Eastern Australia, inspired by Uluru - or Ayers Rock. Aromas of melon, pineapple, and passion fruit, are followed with hints of a citrus palate, balanced by crisp acidity and a refreshing finish.
- 62 **VERDELHO / GEWUERZTRAMINER** £13.50
 Opal Ridge, 2010 (2-3)
 From South Eastern Australia, this blend of two grape varieties has aromas of lemon, lychee, and lime, through to a palate which displays subtle passion fruit and lime flavours. It is a fruity and flavoursome wine, with a lovely zesty finish.

- 63 **SAUVIGNON BLANC (1-2)** £17.00
 Ceravolo 2008
 Wine makers in the south of Italy, the Ceravolo family migrated to Australia and the Adelaide Plains fifty years ago. This fresh, crisp wine has herbaceous aromas, and a zesty but soft minerally palate of tropical lime, passion fruit, and lychee flavours.
- 64 **RIESLING (3)** £13.00
 Stringy Brae 2006
 This straw and green hued wine from the Clare Valley, picked up an award for the best Australian Riesling. With a floral and citrus aroma, it tastes of lemons and limes, and has a lovely, long, crisp finish.

NEW ZEALAND

- 65 **CHARDONNAY** £19.00
 Grove Mill, 2008/09 (2-3)
 From the Marlborough region, this Chardonnay has been made in a full-bodied, fruit led style. It has aromas of nectarine, vanilla and toasty French oak, leading onto a creamy and intensely flavoured palate.
- 66 **RIESLING** £18.50
 Mount Cass, 2007/08 (2)
 Takes its name from the mountain named after Thomas Cass, chief surveyor for Canterbury, New Zealand in 1850. Showing green apple, lime, and spice flavours, with ripe and more complex citrus flavours from a good influence of botrytis. It is clean and fresh, with a hint of sweetness and a crisp finish.
- 67 **SAUVIGNON BLANC** £16.00
 Francesca Bay 2010 (2-3)
 This wine went down very well at one of our staff tastings! It is lush and plump, and yet precise and pure. It tastes and smells of lots of fruit - gooseberries, grapefruits, lemons, and limes.

SOUTH AFRICA

- 68 **CHENIN BLANC** £10.00
 DeWaal, Stellenbosch 2009/10 (2)
 The DeWaal family boasts nine generations of wine growers. This dry easy drinking white is lightly wooded, and has fruity aromas with a hint of honeysuckle. Its producers recommend it with creamy pasta dishes, salmon, tuna, chicken, and salads.

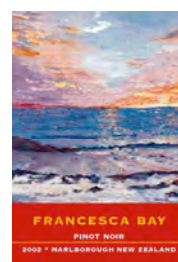
- 69 **SAUVIGNON BLANC** £11.00
 The Veldt Range 2010 (2)
 Both the palate and the nose are dominated by rich, gooseberry and greengage fruits, backed up by a herbaceous crispness. If, like me, you weren't sure what greengage is - it is a green sweet variety of plum named after the botanist, Sir W Gage.

CHILE

- 70 **CHARDONNAY, RESERVE** £16.00
 Torreón de Paredes 2008/09 (2)
 Estate grown and bottled like all of the Torreón de Paredes wines, this wine is matured in one year old French oak barrels. This oakiness is balanced with tropical fruit flavours, giving the wine a long, smooth, finish to its taste.

ARGENTINA

- 71 **VERDHELO** £15.50
 Don Cristobal, Mendoza 2010 (2-3)
 Verdhele is one of the four grape varieties used in the making of Madeira. This Argentinean white, taking its origins from Portugal, is characterised by its gentle fruity aromas with floral tones and its freshness -highlighted by its balanced citrus flavours in the mouth.

- 72 **ROSE D'ANJOU (4-5)** £13.00
A.C. Les Roitelles, 2009/10
This wine was the original rose on our first wine list, and still continues to be popular. It is a delicate, medium-sweet pink wine, with plenty of good fruity summer flavours. Made from the Cabernet Franc grape.

SPAIN

- 73 **CAMPILLO RIOJA ROSE (2)** £16.75
Bodegas Campillo 2009
Spanish wine lists will have as many rose wines listed, as it will have red and white wines. This rose from the north of Spain is light, fruity, and aromatic, with a bouquet of raspberry, strawberry, and peaches. It's palate is light and refreshing, with good balance and a crisp finish.

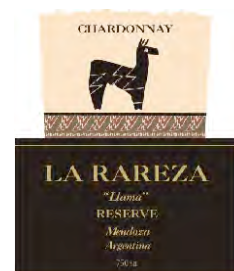
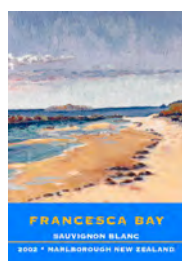
- 74 **PINOT GRIGIO ROSE** £11.00
La Casada, 2009/10 (2)
A delicate, very light rose wine from vineyards near Venice. Its pleasant unobtrusive nature goes easily with starters, white meat, and seafood, but perhaps works best as an aperitif. A light party wine.

CHILE

- 75 **CABERNET SAUVIGNON ROSE** £11.00
Las Condes, 2010 (2)
