## **Thursday the 8th of January**

The first organised activity will be a sherry reception in **room 9 on the first floor of the main building**. This will give you the opportunity to meet your hosts from the Green Park and Bertram Aitchison, as well as your fellow guests. Bertram will go on to outline his plans for the following days.

#### From 6.30pm - 8.00pm.

A four course dinner will be served in the dining-room, followed by coffee and shortbread in the main lounges.

## Friday the 9th of January

#### 8.00am - 9.45am.

A full Scottish breakfast will be served in the dining-room.

## 10.00am - 12.00 noon. Scottish genre painting

The Kailyard School of Painting is a phrase used to describe the painting which featured prominently in the presentation of rural scenes; the scope of such genre painting was adopted by several artists, like John Robertson Reid and the Faed Brothers to depict everyday life in the wider sense.

## Each day a buffet lunch will be served in the dining room. This lunch will be available between 12.30 and 1.30pm.

Those not on the art course are welcome to join you for lunch as well, and the cost of any lunches they take with you will just be added to their final account.

#### 2.00pm - 4.00pm. A legacy of Sir Walter Scott

Walter Scott was the most famous novelist in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century and his written word became an inspiration for artists in Europe. His fictional characters were the subject of many paintings which are still vivid in art and literature.

#### From 5.30pm.

A pre-dinner sherry reception in the main lounge.

#### From 6.00pm - 8.00pm.

A four course dinner will be served in the dining room, followed by coffee and shortbread in the main lounge.

## **Saturday the 10th of January**

#### 8.00am - 9.45am.

A full Scottish breakfast will be served in the dining-room.

## 10.00am - 12.00 noon. The royal patronage of William Dyce

It was a long and productive career that saw Dyce rise in estimation as he worked his way through the British institutions to become a favoured artist by Prince Albert. This brought him recognition and prestige but also many professional problems.

A buffet lunch will be served in the dining room between 12.30 and 1.30pm.

## 2.00pm - 4.00pm. William McTaggart reigns

In the 19<sup>th</sup> Century Scottish rural paintings and seascapes became increasing popular as the century wore on and this artist's work exemplifies the style changes. Being strongly influenced in the early part of his career by the Pre-Raphaelites he developed into the premier exponent of the sea in expressionist terms.

#### From 5.30pm.

A pre-dinner Sherry reception in the main lounge.

#### From 6.00pm - 8.00pm.

A four course dinner will be served in the dining room, followed by coffee and shortbread in the main lounge.

## **Sunday the 11th of January**

#### 8.00am - 9.45am.

## 10.00am - 12.00 noon. F.D. Fergusson par excellence

Fergusson spent his artistic life between France and Scotland which was interrupted by the war on two occasions. Though associated with the colourists he is very individualistic and developed a forceful imagery which has become his recognisable signature style.

A buffet lunch will be served in the dining room between 12.30 and 1.30pm.

#### 2.00pm - 4.00pm. On the trail of Charles Rennie Mackintosh

Mackintosh is a name that resonates down the decades and he is best known for his modern designs which have left their mark in Glasgow and Europe. Nevertheless, his paintings deserve more accord than they sometimes receive; but through them he demonstrates his versatility.

## Sunday the 11th of January (continued)

#### 6.00pm.

Bert will host an informal bucks-fizz reception in the main lounge. Everyone will have downed tools by now, and this is an excellent opportunity to unwind and enjoy the company of your compatriots.

#### From 6.00pm - 8.00pm.

A full Scottish breakfast will be served in the dining room.


